

Introduction

This booklet contains the Rhythm of Daily Prayers currently in use at Ffald y Brenin. We trust that they will lead you into blessing as you make use of them, and that you catch the rhythm to which the Holy Spirit is dancing.

Our style is structured and reflective with plenty of space for the Lord to meet with us.

We normally start Morning and Evening Prayer in particular with singing, but you are welcome to use whatever form of worship is suitable for you.

Psalms have formed the foundation for worship for thousands of years. They express our humanity and God's mercy. We use our own cycle of Psalms in the morning, and our evening readings mean that the whole of the New Testament is read in a year. We believe that it is important to have sequential readings rather than random choice if we are to hear what God is saying.

Friday - Blessings

During Morning Prayer on Fridays we take the opportunity to speak (not pray) blessings into our local community and commend that practice to you. Please enquire if you would like more information about speaking blessings.

Caleb Anchor Points - Simple Rhythm of Prayer

At various points you will see an anchor sign. The Caleb Anchor Points, summarised on page 11, are taken from each of the four services held in the Chapel at Ffald y Brenin and may be used as a simple rhythm of prayer in their own right.

They are a convenient form to use when travelling or away from home.

MORNING PRAYER

We pray slowly and reflectively

We pray slowly and reflectively

In the Name of the Father, And of the Son. And of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Be in the eye of all who see us; In the mouth of all who speak with us.

Keep us in the beautiful attitudes, Joyful, simple and gentle.

Pause ...

And may the favour of the Lord our God be upon us; Establish for us the work of our hands; Establish the work of our hands!
